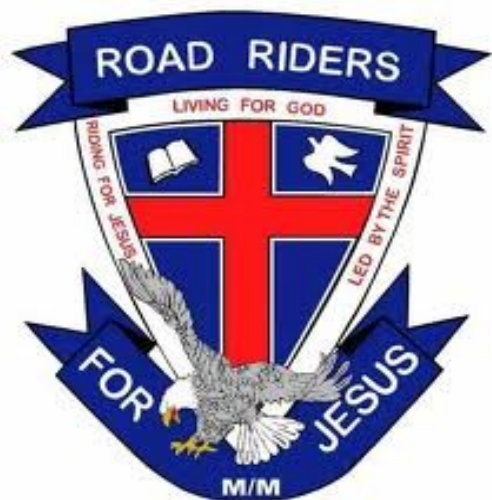

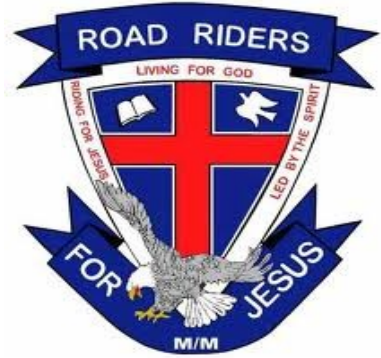

The second thing I want to talk about is on August 24<sup>th</sup> we have been invited to join in a bike ride by the "Kennels of Levi" This is a fundraiser by Sue Thomas, who decided to partner with Harley-Davidson in Lebanon, NH to have a Motorcycle Benefit Ride through the Green Mountains of Vermont to raise as much money as they can to help make the Kennels of Levi: EPEC Service Dogs a reality!

For those who are not familiar with Sue Thomas, Sue is profoundly deaf and also lives with Multiple Sclerosis. About 10 years ago her name became a household word through a TV series called, "Sue Thomas: "FBEYE" which starred a deaf woman who read lips for the FBI in Washington DC. At her side was her trusty companion, Levi, her trained Hearing Dog. It was a family friendly weekly show that ran for 3 1/2 years and whose goal was to not only bring awareness to disabilities, but also to how service dogs can open a person's world.

Today God has led her to Vermont, and there she is carving out a small retreat center where hearing people can enter into the silence and listen to the still small voice of God.

(She has convinced us that hearing people can be very distracted when it comes to hearing God!) Along-side that small retreat area is a vision to build a training center for Service Dogs for Deaf and Disabled. It is a joint ministry where hopefully those who come to receive a service dog will also be exposed to a witness for Christ.

I think this is a worthwhile venture and an excellent opportunity for us to get some exposure for Road Riders for Jesus. I would encourage all members to participate. (I'm thinking a booth with the banner and info).

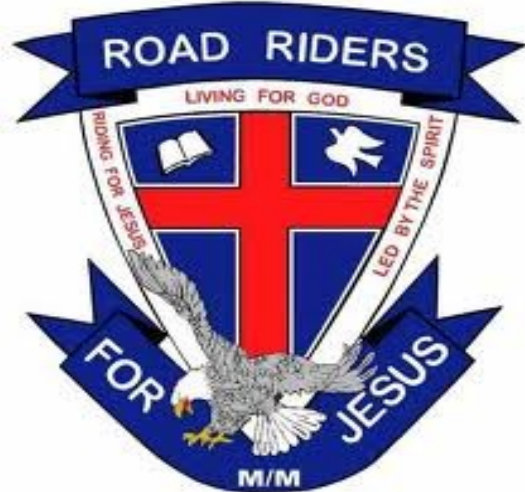
I want to remind everyone to be safe on the road. Drive like Jesus is watching because He is!! Use safety protocol and spread love and kindness.

I like to put in one other with the Romans,

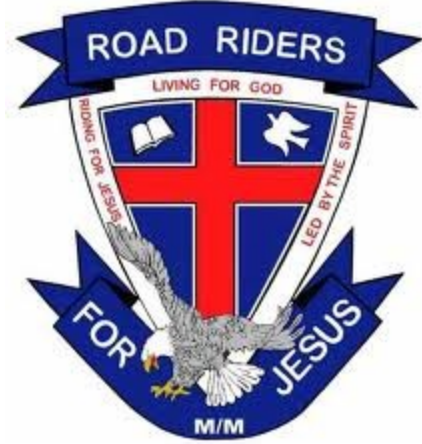

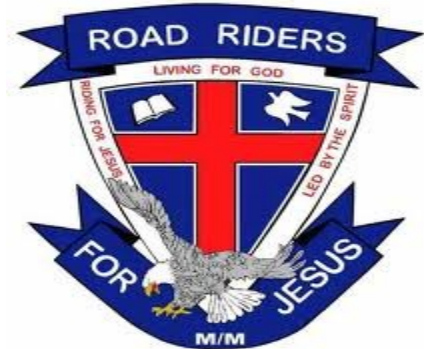

I was then stationed in Massachusetts three times, New York, England, Japan, Vietnam, and Germany before retiring in 1977 as a Chief Master Sergeant. 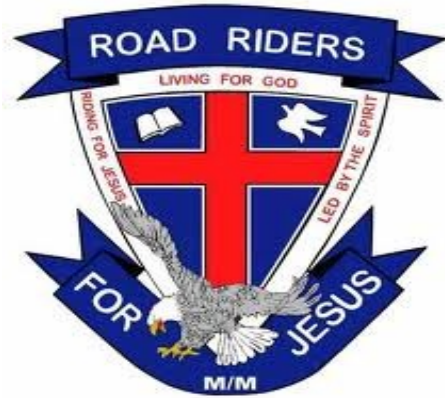
